Saturday July 2:

Welcome

Sunday July 3:

Nijmegen City Tour

On Sunday we will take you on a tour through our lovely 2000 year old city.

... We will tell you some interesting facts, show you some very nice streets and buildings, we will pass through te Valkhofmuseum (local art & archeology) and finish the day with a pancake dinner on a boat trip on our river 'De Waal' (www.museumhetvalkhof.nl).

Monday July 4:

Country Cycling Tour

On Monday we will go cycling through the lovely surroundings of Nijmegen, first through the flat Ooij area: a lovely watery 'polder' district and then we will see if you can conquer the famous 7 hills of Berg en Dal by bike. We will drop by the famous WW II Liberation Museum in Groesbeek (www.bevrijdingsmuseum.nl).

In the evening we will do a pizza baking workshop a Nijmegen's finest pizzeria 'Il Nano'.

Tuesday July 5:

Outdoor Games Day

A day in the country where we will do some outdoor games such as raft building. This water based competitive team challenge involves constructing a raft from barrels, planks and rope with a little technical training. It's going to be great fun. We will dine all together outside at the waterside.

Wednesday, July 6:

Amsterdam City Tour
